



ASUM Events Terms and Conditions

These terms and conditions apply to you as a registrant (Registrant) for one or more ultrasound education events hosted by ASUM (the Event) to be organised, prepared and delivered by a scientific speaker (Speaker) to the Australasian Society for Ultrasound in Medicine ABN 64 001 679 161 (ASUM), a not-for-profit organisation limited by guarantee.

By accepting these terms and conditions, the Registrant covenants with ASUM as follows:

1. ASUM is a facilitator, promoter and administrator for the Course. ASUM will assist a Registrant enrol in an Event and provide information to the Registrant about the Course.
2. The content of each Event will be developed by the Speaker and is (and will remain) the intellectual property and responsibility of the Speaker. The content of a Course includes all materials, presentations, documents, and any other content created for the Course, whether not the Registrant receives it.
3. The Speaker is solely responsible and liable for the accuracy, completeness and currency of, and the originality of, the content and information. ASUM does not assess, check, confirm, guarantee, endorse or verify the content of any Speaker's presentation.
4. The Speaker is responsible for information, materials, claims or assertions provided in, presented as part of, or made available by the Speaker, whether before, during or after the Event.
5. The Speaker is responsible for ensuring that the content of a presentation is original and / or properly cited, and that no course material breaches the copyright or other intellectual property rights of any other person. Any and all claims of plagiarism or breaches of intellectual property rights should be directed to the Speaker, who will be responsible for addressing and resolving such issues.
6. The Registrant agrees that it has not relied on any representation or warranty given by ASUM when agreeing to register for or enrol in an Event.
7. If a Registrant has any inquiries, claims or disputes related to or connected with an Event, its content or its materials, the Registrant should contact asum@asum.com.au. ASUM may direct questions regarding the content or materials to the Speaker.
8. Personal data of a Registrant collected by ASUM shall be used for purposes connected with delivering the Event. The Registrant agrees that personal data provided to ASUM may be shared with, and used by, third parties in accordance with ASUM's [Privacy Policy](#).

9. Any cancellation request from a Registrant in connection with an Event must be received via email addressed to events@asum.com.au at least 14 days prior to the date of the Event. A cancellation fee of \$150 is payable by the Registrant upon cancellation of an enrolment in a Course. The Registrant will not be eligible for or entitled to a refund of any Event fees if the Registrant cancels its enrolment in a course in the period 14 days prior to the date of an Event. Where the event registration fees are less than \$150, the full registration fee amount applies as a cancellation fee.
10. ASUM reserves the right to cancel an Event within 14 days of the due date if there are insufficient registrations for the Course or at any time if extraordinary circumstances arise.
11. If ASUM or the Speaker cancels or reschedules an event, ASUM is not responsible for the Registrant's travel and/or accommodation costs.
12. The Registrant is responsible for its own travel insurance when attending, and travelling to and from, an Event.
13. Registrants are expected to behave professionally and appropriately at all Events. ASUM reserves the right to refuse entry or require Registrants to leave.
14. ASUM may film and photograph the event. Registrants consent to being filmed or photographed by ASUM (or its representatives) and to ASUM using the Registrant's name, likeness, image and/or voice in such photographs or films for the purpose of promoting our events, services and products. No remuneration is payable for such use.
15. If any provision of these Terms is deemed invalid or unenforceable, all or part of that provision will be severed from the Terms and will not affect the enforceability of the remaining provisions of the Terms.
16. No waiver of any term shall be deemed a further or continuing waiver of such term or any other term. Any failure to assert any right under the Terms shall not constitute a waiver of such right.
17. In these Terms, a "Force Majeure Event" means any of the following (whether or not foreseeable or anticipated): acts of God, terrorism, war, civil unrest, strike or labour dispute, lack of transportation, breakdown, labour or material shortage, blockade or embargo, supplier failure, epidemic or pandemic, government restriction or recommendation, legal requirement, extreme weather, earthquake, drought, fire, flood, explosion, natural disaster, and/or any other event, cause or circumstance that is beyond our reasonable control.
18. These Terms constitute the entire agreement between ASUM and the Registrant in relation to the Events.
19. The laws of New South Wales govern these terms and conditions.
